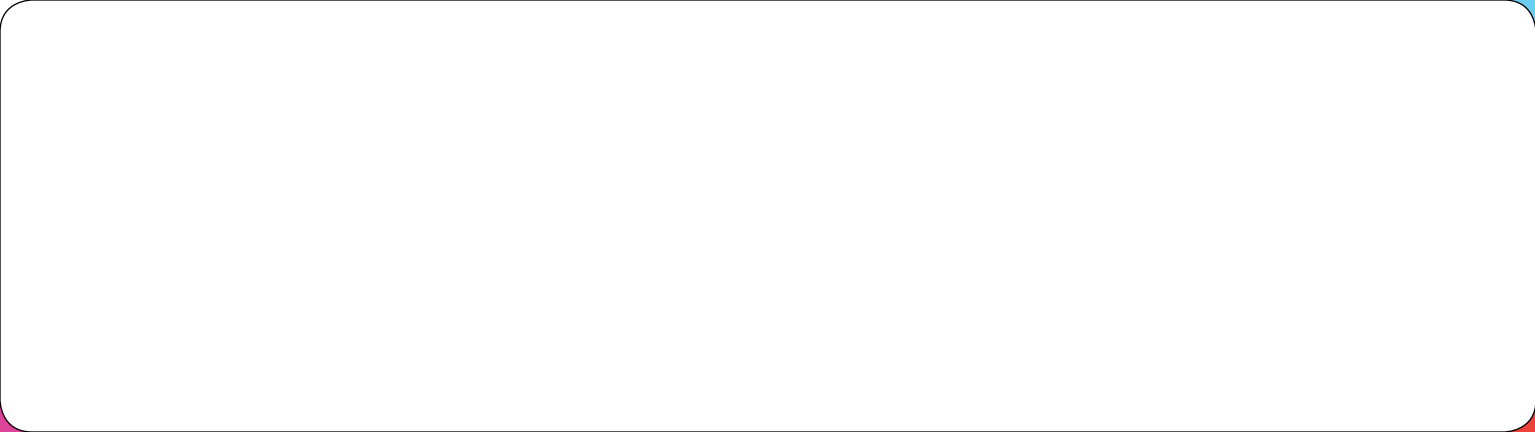

As the 25th anniversary year of Chesapeake Bay Academy offered us the opportunity to take stock of all that had come before, so too did it provide the occasion to plant the seeds of the next field of dreams. I am honored to have partnered with our wonderful students and their families, our extremely talented faculty and staff, and our incredibly committed board of trustees as we worked to till the future of CBA.

Our growth took many forms, beginning with growth in enrollment. The school year opened with a 10% increase, year-over-year. The lower school program, in particular, was blooming as it literally doubled in size creating a beautiful and vibrant new crop of students to set down roots in the CBA community.

In support of our new students, a new group of programs and offerings to cultivate their intellectual and physical development were introduced.

These offerings included:

- Online and Blended Curriculum
- Band and Individual Instrumental Instruction
- Speech & Language, Social Skills and Art Therapy Services
- Yoga and Mindfulness Instruction
- After-School Drama and Karate Instruction

These programmatic opportunities were facilitated in part by the building improvements that housed them. The creation of the beautiful new stage, the renovation of the gymnasium, and the upgrade of the wireless access points throughout the building allowed many of these new opportunities to come to life.

The opportunity to add so many of these programs and initiatives to the landscape at CBA was the result of the tremendous philanthropic support of the community – both the school community and that of greater Hampton Roads – which you will learn much more about throughout this report. Of paramount importance was the increased support of our students through dollars received in the form of financial assistance. As CBA became a recipient of the new Education Improvement Scholarship Tax Credit Program, we were incredibly blessed to continue to provide support to over 50% of our students. There is not a question that the continued generosity of our community is what allows us to make this outstanding educational experience available to our students and for that we are eternally grateful.

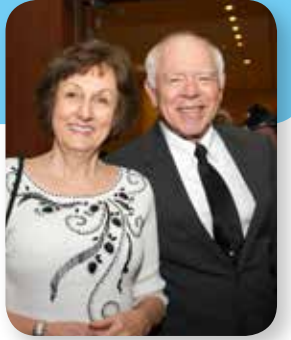
